DSPL 1 Support with ENF

As a DSPL we are able to provide support in the following ways:

- Signposting to appropriate services.
- Termly SENCo briefings to keep staff updated on County strategy.
- Collaborative working between NESSie, Behaviour Support Teams and Family Support Workers.
- Collaborative working with ISL and other professionals.

Ways to make your application stronger.

There are a number of ways that you can make your applications as strong as possible:

- Attend pre-cluster and cluster meetings, even if you do not have a case this gives you a good example of what good applications look like and feedback helps support future applications.
- Pair up with an experienced SENCo who has had good results from ENF.

As a DSPL the main purpose of this role is to liaise with all stakeholders in the DSPL 1 area and provide feedback. We are unable to support individual schools with writing applications. This would be both unworkable (we do not have capacity to support all the schools in the area) and as I sit on the ENF panel it would be unethical and be a conflict of interests.

“SPEED DATING” – Primary to Secondary Transition Meetings



From this year this will be your ONLY opportunity to speak to Secondary SENCOs about transition and it is vital that you attend in order to ensure the best transition.

What is ‘Speed-dating’?

These are our Primary to Secondary transition meetings between SENCOs for participating Secondary Schools in North Herts. It is the opportunity to pass on information for SEND children. Please note that any matters that are Pastoral are not discussed at these meetings.

Secondary Schools:

- Knights Templar
- Fearnhill
- The Highfield
- The Priory
- Hitchin Boys School
- Hitchin Girls School

How does it work?

A day is set aside at The Pod in Letchworth. The Secondary SENCOs are based there for the day and Primary SENCOs are allocated time slots to drop in and discuss pupils. DSPL 1 organise the date and venue. Time slots are booked via Emma Russell, Delivery Manager.

When is it?

Proposed date Tuesday, 28 April 2019 between 9am and 3:30pm at Letchworth Garden City Partnership Pod, Letchworth. Early means pupils can be included in Secondary transition programmes and extra transitions.

How do I book?

An email will be sent to all SENCOs confirming all the details. You will be able to book a place via Emma Russell, Delivery Manager (nhdsplmanager@wilshire.herts.sch.uk). Time slots will be allocated to you.

What if I only have one pupil to discuss?

We appreciate that for a Primary School SENCO this will mean taking time away from school rather than a telephone call. However, this may be the case for a number of Primary schools and will have time implications on a Secondary school SENCO. We hope by giving enough time ahead of the date that you will be able to plan accordingly. Emma will also be visiting headteacher meetings and will reiterate this.



NESSie has 4 legs:

1. Student Support, 0-25 year olds

We provide quality assured arts therapists and counsellors who have experience working in a range of settings including early years, nursery, primary, secondary schools and special educational needs (SEN) settings. We work both 1-1 and in groups, commissioned locally or funded directly by schools.

2. Staff Training and Support Forums


Staff Forums offer support and information sharing. Themes arise from the needs of the group which may include emotional literacy, anxiety and resilience, bereavement, understanding attachment behaviours and sharing good practice.

3. Linking closely with outside agencies

These services include schools, local CAMHS commissioners, National funding bodies, DSPL management groups, local mental health and well-being groups and services. We are affiliated with the Anna Freud Centre, The Judge Business School (Cambridge) and Anglia Ruskin University (Cambridge)

4. Parent/Carer Support Forums

Parent Forums have been developed locally as a platform where ideas and experiences can be shared and supported. Training, advice and information is provided by qualified therapists, and is an opportunity to network and connect with other parents.



Why some referrals were declined:

These children demonstrated little emotional health need or where already under CAMHS.

These referrals were followed up with a decision email and, when appropriate, a consultation meeting.

Refusal to engage:

Of the accepted referrals, one child was referred for alternative support to meet their specific need.


Arts Therapy Provision
